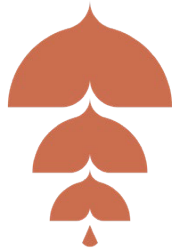

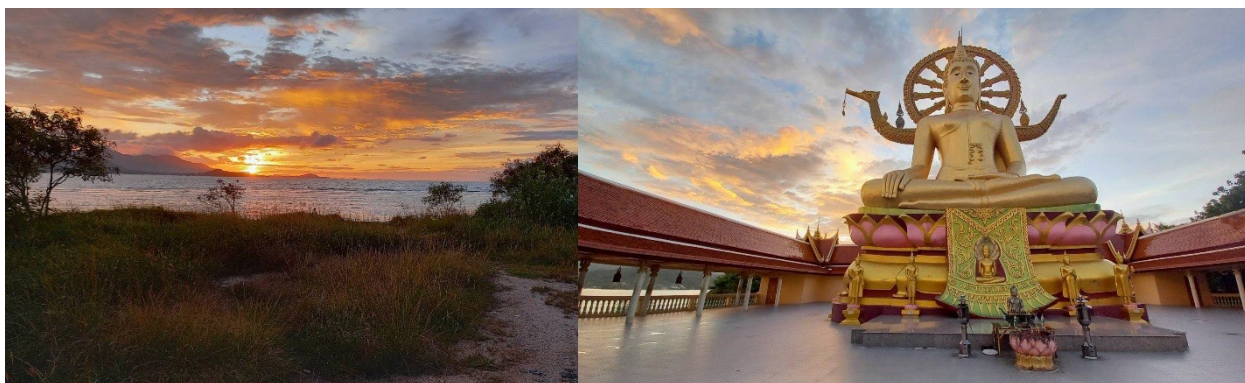

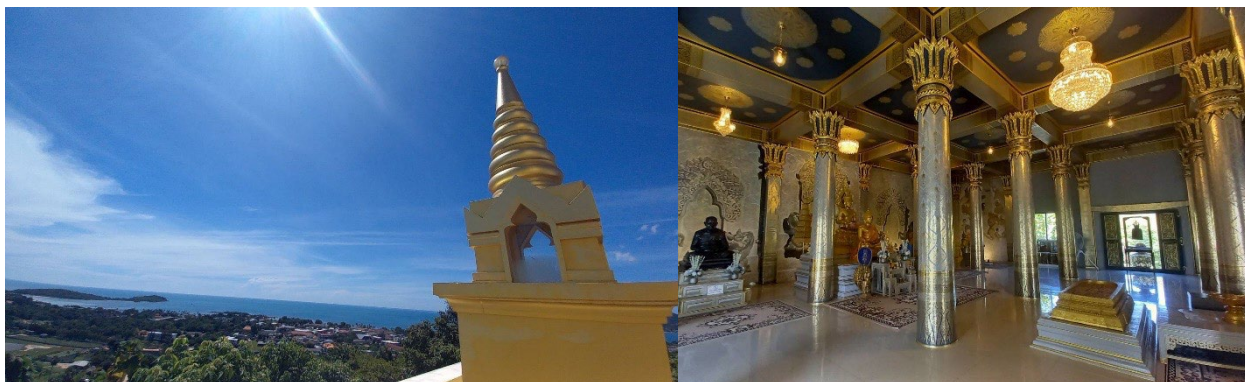
Big Buddha Temple

The Big Buddha temple sits on a small rocky island off Koh Samui's northeastern corner. Known locally as Wat Phra Yai, its golden, 12-metre-tall seated Buddha statue is one of the island's most popular attractions. Set on Koh Faan, the temple is reached by a causeway that connects it to the main island. The Big Buddha, which can be seen at a distance of several kilometers, is often the first landmark people see when arriving in Koh Samui by air. Sitting on the rocks 'behind' the Buddha statue for sunset is a peaceful, calming and tranquil experience not to be missed.



Khao Hua Jook Temple

Sitting atop a hilly terrain, Wat Khao Hua Jook offers great views of the surrounding areas. The hilly terrain reaches approximately 90 meters above sea level, and visitors who make the climb will certainly enjoy the panoramic views from the summit.

Local Experiences

Wat Sila Ngu

Some people call this the 'red temple' because the walls and the sculptures decorating the temple are red. It has 100-year-old architecture and beautiful natural surroundings. Inside the temple, you will also find some beautiful artwork, sculptures, and beautiful Buddhist illustrations.



Wat Samret-Secret Hall of Buddha

The main attraction here is the beautiful solid marble Buddha statue in the main prayer hall, while an adjacent structure filled with seated Buddha figures is equally impressive.



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Local Experiences

Laem Sor Pagoda (Beach) & Laem Sor Temple (Hillside)

One of Koh Samui's lesser known attractions is the Laem Sor pagoda in the South West corner of the island. This part of Samui is not much visited and quiet, compared to the beach resorts on the Eastern side of the island. There is also a temple on the hilltop nearby which provides spectacular sea views.

Wat Panga (Chinese Temple of Guanying)

This temple is called Wat Panga or “Chinese Temple of Guanying and it is located in a remote area of Taling Ngam in the Southern part of Koh Samui. This temple has not been commercialized at all and the locals simply visit here for a blessing from the local monks that reside here. Its rocky but quiet beach is an idyllic spot contemplation.



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
